VISA

U.S. Corporate Political Contributions

Visa makes corporate political contributions in strict compliance with applicable laws and the [Political Participation, Lobbying, and Contributions Policy](#). While corporations are not permitted to contribute to U.S. federal political campaigns or to national political parties, they can contribute to state and local candidates in many jurisdictions and 527 organizations.

In the United States, Visa makes contributions to state and local candidates and ballot measures, trade associations and other tax-exempt organizations that engage in election-related spending, and organizations registered under Section 527 of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code.

Visa contributes financially to candidates evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Views, voting record, and understanding of policy issues of importance to Visa, its shareholders, and other stakeholders;
- Reputation for integrity;
- Service in a party or legislative leadership position;
- Relationship to or representation of a Visa facility or a large concentration of Visa employees; and
- The extent to which the potential recipient shares Visa's legislative priorities.

Visa recognizes that any contribution made to a candidate or political organization does not mean we endorse all of that candidate's or organization's views. Visa reserves the right to discontinue support of any contribution recipient.

Political contributions will not be given in anticipation of, in recognition of, or in return for, any official act and corporate funds may not be used for any unlawful, improper, or unethical purpose.



2026 Visa Inc. U.S. Corporate Political Contributions:

This report provides an update on corporate political contributions made by Visa in the United States from January 1, 2026, to June 30, 2026. All contributions disclosed in this report were initiated in the calendar year 2026, as of June 30, 2026, but the report does not reflect whether the payments have been processed by the recipients.

This report includes all applicable corporate contributions made by Visa, including any payments to U.S. tax-exempt organizations engaged in advocacy (including 501(c)(3), (4), and (6) organizations) if Visa determined that the contribution in question was used for political activities. The political contributions listed are aggregated and may reflect contributions to multiple campaign committees associated with a single legislator and may also reflect primary and/or general election contributions and party conferences. All contributions are listed in U.S. dollars.
